


# University of Vienna: blending innovation and tradition in one of the most liveable cities in the world



# ERC grants and Nobel Prize: cutting-edge research

**143 ERC grants** have been awarded to researchers from the University of Vienna since 2007.


To receive funding from the European Research Council (ERC), research projects must have a high potential for innovation. The University of Vienna is especially proud of the award of the 2022 Nobel Prize in Physics to Anton Zeilinger.





# Studies: individual specialisation through a wide range of degree programmes

- There are 2 million people living in Vienna, more than 10% of whom are students from 120 different nations. Approximately 85,000 students study at the University of Vienna.
- The University offers 187 degree programmes (bachelor's, master's, diploma and doctoral programmes).
- Together with cooperating university colleges of teacher education, the University of Vienna is also the largest teacher education institution in Austria, encompassing 29 school subjects/specialisations.
- 2023 highlights: new STEM programmes: Digital Literacy and Informatics; Neuroscience, Cognition, Behaviour and Neurobiology
- 30% of the master's programmes are offered in English.







## New professorial appointments

- More than 70 new professorships were advertised at the end of 2018
- More professorship positions have been advertised since then
- Qualitative and quantitative investment, biggest expansion of the University of Vienna since its advance in the second half of the 19th century
- Mainly international appointments in fields of future strategic importance
- Continuing the successful appointment of professors from abroad in 2023: 17 university professors and 26 tenure-track professors
- A share of 49% women among professorial appointments
- Current appointments contribute significantly to sharpening our research profile and are at the interface between disciplines





## The University of Vienna in the world

- Approx. 90 university-wide partnership agreements
- Approx. 330 ERASMUS+ partner universities
- Students from approx. 120 nations
- 58% of new professors in 2023 have been appointed from an international environment


#### International publication collaborations 2021–2023
